Description

Presentation Cricket Ball.

A very nice Stuart Surridge & Co.Ltd. cricket ball with two silver plaques commemorating three wickets with three balls by E.H Darvell. The first engraving states:

'E.H. Darvell, Fencibles Cricket Club v. Northwood Cricket Club. Three Wickets with Three Balls. 28th. May 1950'

The second plaque reads.:

'E.H. Darvell, Fencibles Cricket Club v. Tring Park Cricket Club, Three Wickets with Three Balls. 19th. August 1951.'

The plaques are with silver Birmingham hall marks and makers initials W.B. The ball comes with an ebonised antique stand.

Cricket during the Second World War in the Chiltern area was limited but the 1941 season kicked off with inter-platoon matches between the Chesham Home Guard, with C versus D platoon and A versus B. B platoon originally used the Chiltern Rugby Club pavilion as a HQ and the B platoon was the later basis of Fencibles Cricket Club.
