Description

Vintage Three Piece Hardy Trout Fly Rod, The 'C.C. de France'.

The Hardy 'C.C. de France' is a split cane Palakona 3-piece rod with spare tip made by Hardy's of Alnwick. The rod is in good used condition with red silk whippings, suction joints, adjustable alloy universal reel holder, two wood and cork stoppers and 10" cork handle. It has the registration number E87924 dating it to 1953. The rod is 9' long and is in the original Hardy's canvas bag. The rod has the painted black inscription spiralling around the shaft 'the 'C.C. de France', 'Palakona' and 'Regd. Trade Mark.'. The butt and end rings are Agate, intermediate are snake rings. The three pieces measure 35¼", 36" & 37", spare tip is also 35¼".

A very light rod of great power, similar to rods used with many successes in the Casting Club de France Tournaments.

Action: Inclined Stiff, for wet or dry fly.

Pieces: Two with one top. 'Palakona' split-bamboo.

Handle: cork covered, plain shaped.

Joints: suction.

Rings: Butt and end Agate, intermediate "snake".

Tyings: Ordinary spaced narrow bands, cane-coloured silk.

Reel fittings and furnishings: universal.
